As no meetings can be held, Facebook is being used extensively and has over 900 members, reaching a broad range of residents and covering many issues, including updates on Humberside Police Operation Galaxy. NW is serving the community in a number of way, including helping vulnerable residents and help with personal alarms. Cllr Bruce invited anyone wishing to join NW to contact him.
